For a lively Newton home, Duckham Architecture & Interiors and kdtuner fashioned a backyard design where fun was the program. Indoor-outdoor connections, like striking French doors that swing out to the patio and covered porch, link the setting to the living and dining rooms. The thoughtful placement and flow of its amenities make for easy entertaining, as meals can be prepared in the outdoor kitchen and plated either on the porch or in the dining room. The space was meant for the enjoyment of the entire family—children can be on the swings, while others relax in the hot tub or sit by the fire.

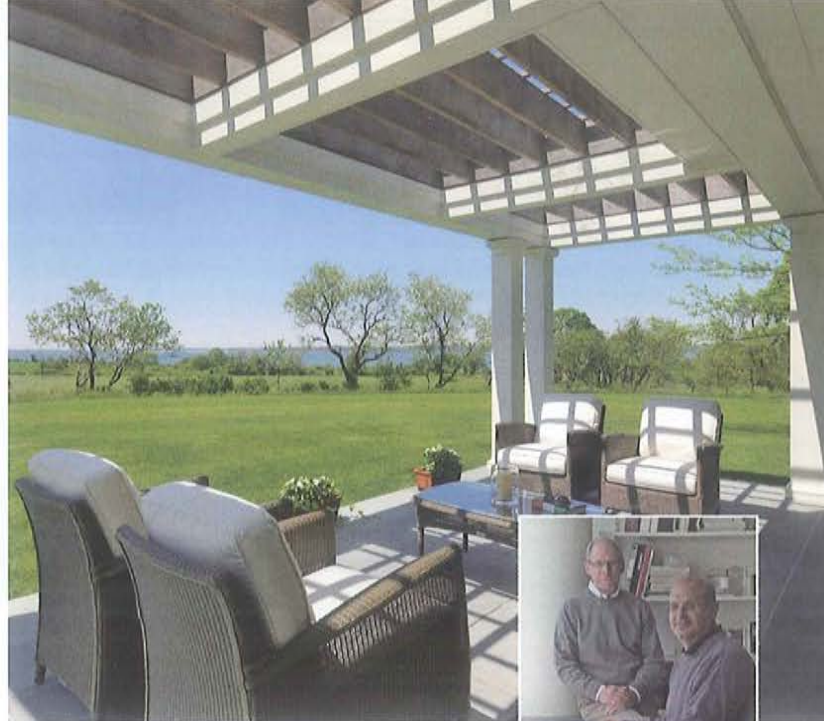

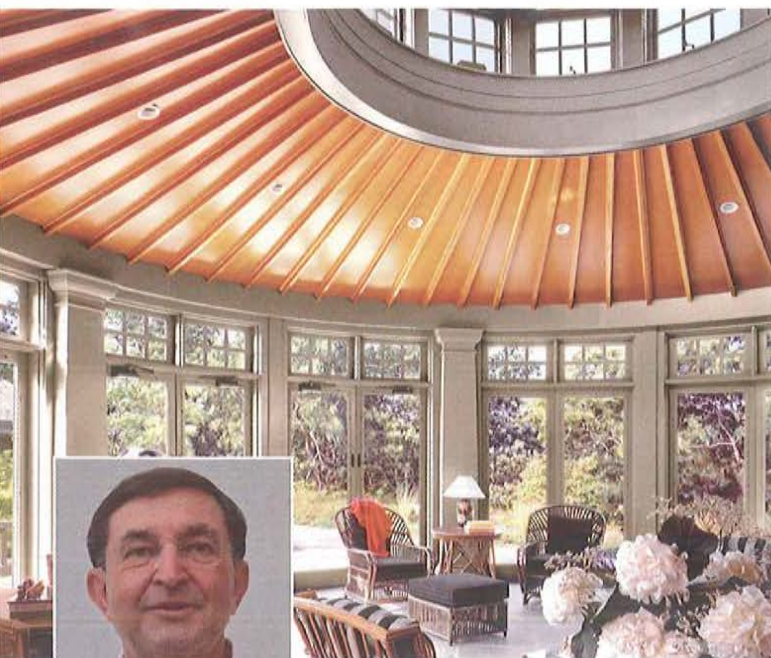
Paul Fiore & David Foley

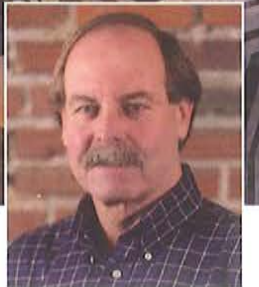
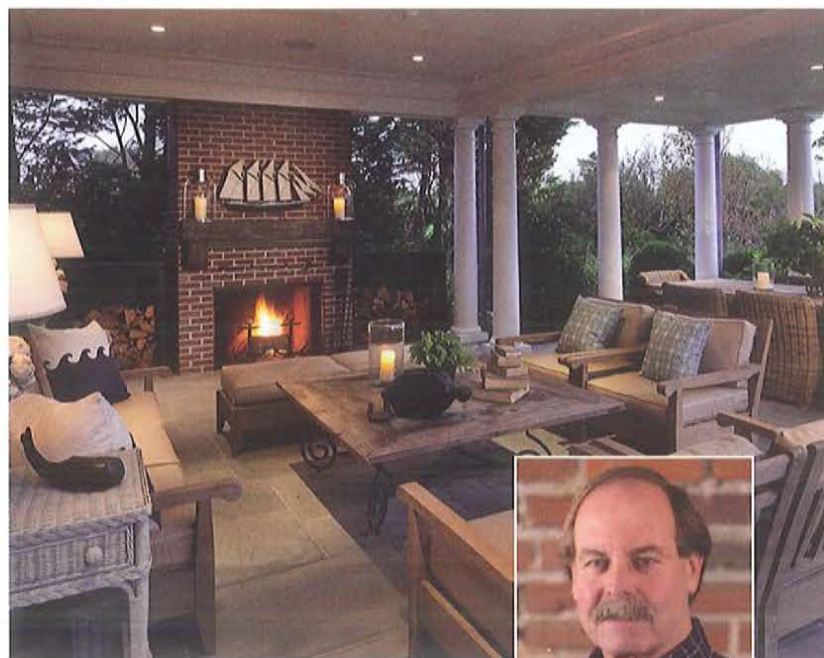
Robert Paladino & Jim Mellowes
